History

Beautiful Eagle Creek Park is all of 3,900 acres of dry land and 1,300 acres of water. Some of this region was purchased by J.K. Lilly of Lilly pharmaceutical in 1936. Later in 1958 Lilly gave the region to Purdue University. The University sold the area to the City of Indianapolis in the late 1960s. It is now one of the largest city parks in the United States and still preserving the natural landscape within the ever growing Circle City.
